# **SPECIAL REPORT:**

Pure Water Presentation - Wendy G. & Amy D. - San Diego's Water Supply

Northern California & Colorado River are our main sources of water in San Diego. Used and re-used by communities upstream. Challenges with imported water due to the energy it takes to get to San Diego. Pumping restrictions were applied to protect endangered species but that also limits the amount of water dispensed to the rest of the state.

Normal rainfall was not enough replenish supply.

Cost of imported water has tripled since 2000 and will double within the next 10 years.

Per-person usage is lower, conservation was made great strides, and is now 50% lower.

Through conservation facilities nearby, we have treated waste water to a high level mainly for irrigation/industrial purposes. (Purple Pipe System)

Evaluation of feasibility has led to Pure Water being able to produce over 80 million gallons of treated water. Individual projects: North City Reclamation Plant – needs to expand to continue to provide water for the purification process as well as being able to serve recycled water customers.

Pure Water continues to make great strides to further the expansion of treatment facilities.

Improvement requires additional parking - conducted feasibility study to gain access off Mercy Road

<u>Concept #1</u>: Restroom facility in centralized area with limited parking/driving access (emergency access only)

<u>Concept #2</u>: No restroom facility in centralized area & allows driving access to go further into park site but limited parking available.

Preliminary construction cost: \$4,750,000 total

Additional cost including overhead, unsure of total cost

Community members share their opinions and provide input:

No available parking is a concern--shared parking available down below but only 7 spaces available at top Residential concerns--the influx of people is a concern to residents feeling safe

Survey of 37 out of 75,000 people in Mira Mesa is not an big enough number to constitute a successful study-the survey did not include information presented in workshop

-restrooms, parking concerns,-overall cost of design concept

-lights

\$5,000,000 can be better spent on a concept that is fully supported.

We need to make the park accessible to everyone--not an open space park but a resource park. The view is the resource so it is important to allow for many visitors.

Workshop was initially designed for community input- to work together to come up with a plan to successfully design a park that meets the needs of the community. This is the first step in the process of making that happen, the GDP must be approved by final group with board of rec.

Additional informational meeting will be conducted after initial meeting to present further information on this concept. Goal is to gain full community support by involving all 75,000 of the community of the survey/study. This item will return to Rec council for design approval at a future date.
